What to Bring:

- Sleeping bag + pillow some staff choose to bring "real" bedding, a mattress topper, etc.
- Bible, notebook, and pen/pencil
- Clothes* (include warm clothes, rain jacket, socks, sneakers, clothes that can get a little messy, and modest swimsuit). *see Clothing Guidelines below
- Personal items (toiletries, towel, and bag for dirty clothes).
- Shower shoes
- Sunscreen
- Sunglasses
- Flashlight
- A watch with an alarm, or, additionally, an alarm clock

Suggested:

- Silly dress-up clothes/costumes! Example: animal onesie
- Spending money for the camp store You will have the opportunity to open an "account" at the Snack Shack along with your campers.

Some counselors have gone the extra mile to add a personal touch to their cabin. Here are some ideas that have been successful for cabin bonding and unity in the past. These are by no means mandatory! And don't let this list limit you either.

- Cabin decorations
- Welcome gift for campers
- Bedtime stories
- Cabin bracelets/hats/bandanas
- Coloring books
- Mad libs
- Air fresheners/extra deodorant

Clothing Guidelines:

We understand that not everyone will share our convictions, but we ask that while campers and staff are participating in programs at Dunes Bible Camp, they follow the guidelines we have set:

No clothing with obscene language or imagery No clothing with political flags or slogans. No crop tops. One piece or modest two-piece swimsuits only.

*leadership staff reserves the right to ask a staff member to change if their attire does not meet camp clothing guidelines.

Phone Policy:

We encourage staff not to bring their phones, however we understand that for some staff this isn't possible (many are parents, church leaders, etc.)

However, we require campers not to bring their phones/electronics to camp so that they can focus on being free from distractions and temptations to focus on being relational instead, and we want to join them in this endeavor as much as possible as a staff. Therefore we will ask all staff members to keep any phones out of sight.
